Local News in Brief...

Herrison Hall in Charlton Down remains closed following the collapse of part of the roof at the northern end of the hall. A number of large coping stones have been dislodged and the hall has been closed as a precaution.

The hall committee is hoping a structural survey will determine the cause of the problem and the extent of any remedial work required. In the meantime, users of the hall are having to move events to other local venues, including Charminster Village Hall.

Work starts in October on a "build-out" on North Street near the junction with West Hill. The build- out will help children cross the road safely on their way to and from school.

The plans have been drawn up by Dorset Council highways team and approved by Charminster Parish Council. The works will involve building out the pavements on North Street (near to West Hill) which will enable people crossing the road to see past parked cars and make the road narrower so easier to cross. The scheme will also make visibility better for motorists entering North Street from West Hill near the village hall. Although the visibility splay by the hall will be removed, the village hall committee has been assured that the hall users will be able to load and unload equipment at the North Street entrance.

Talking of herrisons, erinaceinae, urchins or as we usually know them, hedgehogs, life should be a bit safer from now on. The parish council has agreed to



buy two hedgehog warning signs to alert motorists of their presence. *Herrison is the French word for hedgehog, erinaceinae the Latin and urchin is an old English term which led to the naming of spiney sea urchins.

Family Fun Day a big hit

Children and adults alike joined in the fun and games when Charminster School and Pre-school joined forces to hold their annual Fun Day—and raised a whopping £8,705!

Cancelled in 2020, and re-arranged this year because of Covid, the Fun Day got off to a fine start on September 12.

Organiser Glenn Taylor, whose three children attend the school, said the aim was to raise money for all the extras that normal school budgets can't stretch to pay for.



"Some money will go to the sensory garden, but otherwise there is no particular project in mind. Things just crop up and then we are able to fund them," he said.

The last Fun Day raised around £7,500. "It's been harder this year as companies have not been able to provide big raffle prizes and various people have cancelled, so we're thrilled with this result," said Glenn.



* When all money is in, the total raised should hit £9,000.

Howzat! What a season it's been for Charlton Down Cricket Club – on and off the field! Success in league and cup competitions has been matched by growing support for the club's social and community activities.

The midweek team won 18 of their 19 games securing promotion to Division I of the Dorchester and District Evening League and a place in the cup final, where they were narrowly beaten.

The Saturday team also won promotion to Dorset League Division 2. Sid said he was encouraged by the second team results too: "There are some good younger players coming through, which bodes very well for the future of the club."

At the other end of the age scale, almost 50 five- to eight-year-olds took part in the All Stars coaching scheme, and another 19 children, aged eight to eleven, signed up for the Dynamos.

Just as pleasing for Sid was the "buyin" from the local community as lockdown restrictions were eased. Club
members came together and organised regular pizza evenings as well as
several barbecues. The response from
people living in Charlton Down was
"fantastic" according to Sid. Funds

In fact, the Friday night pizza evenings have been so successful that they are going to continue throughout the winter. "It's not just the club that benefits," says Sid, "but the community as a whole."

No swarms

Fruits and vegetables are in abundance but the bees are missing and there were no swarms this year. From everything I hear it is going to be a very poor honey harvest. French beekeepers are calling for government support with losses up to 60%. So numbers going into winter are much reduced. Our feral colony continues to thrive however but there is no chance of sharing their stores.

Ride and Stride will saw Sally Warburton and Chris Gotel taking part. The Historic Churches Trust who support many parishes throughout Dorset with the cost of repairs to their churches raised a record £112,528 including Gift Aid in 2020. Fifty percent of the sponsorship money goes to the rider's church and the remaining 50% is retained by the DHT who then offer it by way of grants to applicant parochial church councils.



From the Clergy...

...with Dick Luther

BBC 4 has launched a study on 'kindness'. An on-line questionnaire asks whether we felt that there was more kindness around since the pandemic.

Apparently there has been a mixed response. Certainly, we're made aware of some unbelievably cruel words and deeds in our world today But we also know of, and have experienced, great acts of kindness. I want to believe that ultimately good will defeat evil.

In the BBC 4 discussion, they said that we've all a responsibility to show kindness; it was a muscle that needed to be exercised. We need motivation and determination. William Penn wrote, "We pass through life but once. If, therefore, there be any kindness I can show, let me do it now for I shall not pass this way again."

Milk of human kindness

The phrase "the milk of human kindness" was first coined by Shakespeare but sadly for Lady Macbeth, it was something she didn't admire about

her husband! She was not a kind woman!

At this season of 'Harvest' we might affirm that a person who sows seeds of kindness will reap a good harvest. Plants don't just need planting, they need watering and weeding. Residents object to additional flats.

People living in the north-east wing of Redwood House in Charlton Down have told parish councillors that plans to convert offices into six new apartments should not be permitted.

Around a dozen residents told councillors that the plans were unacceptable because of concerns about parking and the lack of refuse facilities.

The offices, currently used by the

Leonard Cheshire Charity are due to close shortly, and plans have been submitted to the County Council to convert them to apartments. But people living nearby say this will only aggravate local parking problems — particularly in the evening when people return from work. They are also concerned that the plans make no provision for additional refuse bins.

The parish council decided to lodge a formal objection to the plans. While not objecting to the change of use, members shared residents' concerns about parking and refuse management.


