Dorset says NO to Strawberry Field houses

Campaigners in Charminster have been celebrating Dorset Council's decision to reject plans for 80 new homes on the land off Westleaze which is known locally as Strawberry Field. This comes after several attempts by developers to secure planning permission for the site.

David Shaw, who helped coordinate opposition to the plans, said: "Many thanks to everyone who took the time to submit their objections to the Council or contributed to the fund for the village posters.

The current prospective developers have been defeated for a third time

(two planning refusals and an appeal dismissal) and for now we will retain some of the valued landscape around our village. Let's hope we can continue to keep it that way."

Among reasons given for the refusal of permission were the impact the development would have had on the historic Wolfeton House and the nearby Wolfeton Riding House.

"Welcome result"

Peter Dangerfield was delighted by the decision: "As chair of the Riding House Trust and someone who regards themselves as immensely fortunate to live in Charminster, I salute everyone who has done so much to get this welcome result."

Planners also considered the adverse impact of the development on the site's rural setting.

Campaigner Matt Clarke said: "We were fighting to protect our valued green space, let's hope the developers throw in the towel once and for all!"



Help needed for precious river

The River Cerne flows through the heart of historic Charminster. *Nigel Kay* looks at its significance to the village and our neighbouring countryside.

The Cerne rises in the hills above Minterne Magna and meanders south through Cerne Abbas, Charlton Down and Charminster before joining the River Frome in the water meadows just north of Dorchester. It's barely eight miles long, but it's one of the most precious features of our land-scape.

England's "rainforests"

The Cerne is one of only 200 or so chalk streams in the world, most of which are found here in the UK. And according to environmental organisations and the UK government, they are under threat. One report last year said: "Chalk streams are England's rainforests, and they need help fast."

But how healthy is the River Cerne? And what can we do to improve the quality of our river and the wildlife that lives in and around its water? The river is a blissful spot for children and dogs to cool off in the summer; it supports a wide diversity of wildlife - trout, salmon, freshwater crayfish, kingfishers, and water voles. It helps drain the fields, but historically it's been responsible too for a number of significant floods - most recently, in 2014, when St Mary's Church and a number of homes in the centre of the

village fell victim.

In that time, he says, much of the gravel riverbed has been buried under a layer of silt and there are now far fewer plants that are the basis of the food chain growing in the water. Keith blames changes in land use higher up the valley as well as sewage pollution. It's known that raised levels of nitrogen and phosphorus flowing from the Sydling, Cerne, Piddle

and Frome, as well as from urban areas, have resulted in the excessive growth of weed and algae in Poole Harbour, restricting the food available for wading birds.

But he fears that concentrating on steps to tackle the problem lower down the river system have meant that virtually no work has been done on the Cerne. Now he wants Wessex Water and the Environment Agency to take a long hard look at our river and draw up fresh plans.

Wild life corridor

"We all know about the problems of water contamination by sewage and treatment works, and from farms, but anyone looking at the river today will see that it is dark brown and not crystal clear. It is the silt being washed into the river from fields which were once mostly grass, but are now arable, "said Keith.

And in an ideal world, Keith suggests a wildlife corridor – a continuous strip of land on one or both sides of the river - stretching from Cerne Abbas through Charminster to the Frome. It would, he says, be a home for a huge variety of plants and animals, drawing life and sustenance from its babbling waters.



Amanda Broom, who is the catchment manager for the Dorset Wildlife Trust agrees with Keith's assessment that the quality of the Cerne needs improving. His thoughts about a wildlife corridor are, she says, "a brilliant idea."

The Wildlife Trust has begun working with farmers and landowners along the valley to reduce pollution by fertilisers and limit the soil erosion that forms the silt on the riverbed.

Next month, in part two of this series, we hear from Wessex Water about steps being taken to improve water quality in the River Cerne, and see what we can all do to protect one of the river's rarest species, now threatened with extinction.

News in brief...

...from last month's meeting of Charminster Parish Council

Councillors heard concerns about drainage and road safety when they considered an outline planning application for a new house on the western side of North Street. Residents who attended the meeting said water running off the site would add to the risk of flash flooding and expressed fears about road safety at the junction of the property's drive and North Street.

The application is for a single house on raised ground behind the row of cottages at 24 North Street. Councillors agreed to oppose the application because the proposed building was outside the village's development boundary and was "inconsistent with the conservation area." They said there was also a significant worry that the run-ff from the site would be detrimental to existing properties.

The application will be considered by Dorset Council later in the year.

Road safety on North Street also figured in a discussion about road signs in the village. Traffic using the road was getting faster and heavier said Councillor Keith Beeson. The council agreed that new 30 mph signs would be painted on the road at the northern end of the village.

The council gave the thumbs up to a plan to hold weekly coffee mornings in the Community Hall. Organisers hope the event will appeal to parents after they have dropped off their children at school. Councillors said it was a great initiative that deserved to be encouraged. They agreed to waive hire charges until January. Coffee will be served from 8.45 to 9.45 on Thursdays after half term.

Tales of formal gardens open WI eyes

This is followed on Sunday 28th, the first day of Advent, by a wedding at 2.00 p.m. so no change to Sunday evening service time.



From the Clergy...

...with Hugh Willis

Following the withdrawal of members of our Armed Forces from Afghanistan, many will question why they were there in the first place.

Among the questions being asked we hear "was anything positive achieved?", "was it worth the loss of so many lives?", and "did it benefit the Afghan peoples?" It is worth remembering that the servicemen and servicewomen who went there did so at the directions of the governments that we, as citizens, voted into parliament. Do we share in the responsibilities?

Young lives

Over the years since the end of World War II, our service people have been involved in other actions. Many young lives were lost in those conflicts. Their names have not been recorded on the various memorials in Charminster, Stinsford, or Charlton Down, nor do we have any information on whether any of the service-people who lost their lives actually came from these villages.

Following our usual morning service on 14th November at Charminster, there will be an Act of Remembrance at 10.45am. at the village war memorial which is in the churchyard. As well as humbly remembering those who died in two World Wars, we will also recall the other conflicts in which our armed forces were involved. There will also be a Remembrance Sunday Service at Stinsford; please see the list of church services for timings of that.

We know that the God who gave his Son to bring us reconciliation hears our prayers. This Act of Remembrance is an opportunity to remember with gratitude and sorrow those whose lives were lost that we might live.

Gone but not forgotten

Armistice Day on November 11, and Remembrance Sunday on November 14, will see people gathered at war memorials in towns and villages around the country.

Nearly all those memorials bear the names of local soldiers, sailors and airmen who lost their lives in the first and second world wars.

But what about those service men and women who have died in conflicts since 1945 – a total of 7187 deaths throughout the UK.

Names lost

Retired dentist Dr Hugh Willis, who is an associate minister at St Mary's Church, Charminster, is concerned that there may be local families who lost a father, son, or brother in one of the many conflicts of the last 74 years, but whose names have been lost.

Hugh, who served with the Royal Army Dental Corps for many years and occasionally had to help identify the remains of dead soldiers by their den-

tal records, is sure some names have slipped through the records net.

"There have been a lot of conflicts since the end of World War two, and it may be that some men and women from these villages lost their lives. If so, perhaps we should find some way of honouring them." he said.



If you know of a local man or woman who died during a conflict, please let us know.

* The worst year since 1945 was 1951 when there were 851 operational deaths in three conflicts – the Malayan, the Anglo-Egypt and the Korean wars. There were spikes of more than 100 deaths a year in the early 1970s in Northern Ireland and in 1982 in the Falklands. These figures apply to the entire British armed forces.



Wanted ... a hedgehog high-

way



We might not see

them very often but we all seem to regard them with fondness – hedgehogs, those prickly little nocturnal creatures who potter around our gardens and lanes almost in secret.

Now hedgehog fan Nicky, who has created hedgehog feeding stations, a hedgehog house and hedgehog ramps up the steps in her North Street, Charminster garden, is hoping others in the village will join in looking after her favourite animal.



"I'd love to see a hedgehog highway through the village. If people could cut a little hole in the bottom of their fences, and make a simple feeding station, it would be wonderful for hogs.

"Hedgehogs can travel up to a mile a night looking for food. If they have a surfeit of slugs and snails – their natural food – they can become very ill and full of parasites. If we put out some wet dog food for them, they stay healthier because they still eat slugs (good for gardeners) but fewer of them."

Many people, including shy Nicky who likes to be fairly anonymous, might be concerned that putting food out for hogs will attract rats.

"Rats won't eat tinned dog or meaty cat food. They will go for the dried stuff. We have a camera in our feeding station and we have never seen a rat in there."

Hedgehogs also face other threats, particularly at this time of the year. Bonfires can attract them so it's wise to check yours before lighting it, leaf clearing can harm them and strimmers have caused horrific injuries. And of course, traffic can be a major hog killer.

So let's all Think Hedgehog and preserve our prickly friends.

Final stage for neighbourhood plan

Stinsford's draft neighbourhood plan has now completed all its consultation stages which lie in the hands of the parish council.

The council has updated and hopefully improved the plan in response to comments made by members of the public and interested organisations. Although some sections have been re-drafted, the vision of the plan is still centred on safeguarding the parish's rural peace and quiet, its attractive landscape, and its cultural and natural heritage, while allowing limited and appropriate development to support people continuing to live, work and visit here.

The next step in progressing the plan is in the hands of Dorset Council. They have confirmed that the plan meets the basic legal requirements. They are now providing a further opportunity for people to comment, in the form of the 'Regulation 16' consultation period. This is likely to last until about the end of November – details will be posted on the Dorset Council website and on www.stinsfordnplan.org.uk.

After this stage, the neighbourhood plan will be go to an independent examiner, who can suggest further changes if they think some are needed. Finally – hopefully in 2022 – the plan can be put to a referendum of voters in Stinsford parish, and, if passed by a majority, it will become a key influence on future development in the parish.


