New site for allotments

Charminster's allotment holders have upped sticks and moved to a temporary site off Wanchard Lane. Their former site off Weir View is being cleared for the next phase of the Charminster Farm development.

It's two years since the gardeners learned that they would have to move to make way for new housing. But despite some initial misgivings, the chairman of the new allotments association says the developers Wyatts have tried to make the move as easy as possible.

Temporary

The new site, though, is only temporary, and the plots will be moved again in another year or so to a site by the electricity sub-station further along Wanchard Lane.

Don Rousell has been elected chairman of the newly-formed Charminster Farm Allotments Association. He explained that the original allotments were on land that was privately owned. Under an agreement with



Wyatts, Charminster Parish Council will now take responsibility for the new allotments and charge an annual rent.

Sixteen of the existing allotment holders are moving to Wanchard Lane. Wyatts are providing temporary storage for their tools and other equipment, but when they eventually move to the final site, each allotment will be furnished with a new shed.

End of year

Tim Hoskinson, who is Head of Planning with Wyatt Homes, told The Pilot: "A temporary allotment area has been provided and a new permanent allotment facility located further to the west will be constructed later this year with a view to completing and handing over the new allotments by the end of the year. This will provide much improved facilities with sheds,

water supply, parking, etc as shown on the attached plan. We have worked with the allotment holders to agree these arrangements and the specification for the new allotments. "

But it's not just a question of moving the contents of their tool sheds — many of the gardeners will be moving their plants too. And Don Roussel warns that it won't be easy. The soil on the new site is heavy and still full of large root clumps. Planting this year's fruit and vegetables is likely to be harder work than in a typical year. Fingers crosses for a successful harvest!

The countryside can be shocking

Dorset is a charming, rural county, and here at The Pilot we often remind our readers of the Countryside Code encouraging everyone to enjoy the environment but to keep it safe.

Members of the public are urged to close gates, not stray from marked footpaths and bridleways, and to definitely keep their dogs under control, especially around livestock.

And there's no arguing with that.

Serious shock

But like most things in life, it's a twoway street, and landowners also have a responsibility to ensure safety while protecting their fields and livestock.

Most do, which is why, when walking our dog along a public road, we didn't take much notice of a single strand of wire about 50 cm from the edge of the concrete path and about 50 cm off the ground. But when the dog caught his nose on it while having a sniff at some grass, there was a bang

and the poor chap leapt in the air squealing and howling as he got a serious shock. He was shaking and traumatised for some time.

There was no livestock in any of the surrounding fields at the time, and most importantly, there were no markers anywhere indicating the wire was live.

An offence

According to Dorset Council, "Electric fences alongside a right of way should be adequately signed and give plenty of width to ensure there is no danger of users coming into contact with the electric fence. "It is an offence to put an electric fence across a public right of way too.

So please keep your eyes peeled for unassuming, unmarked wires—they could give your dog, or worse still your child, a very nasty shock. And perhaps landowners might switch them off when there's no cattle or sheep in the fields, but at the very least, mark them. *Marilyn Kay*

Raising the roof at Herrison Hall

Work is soon to be completed on the gables and roof at the front of Herrison Hall, after there was severe damage during a storm about a year ago.

Since then, the hall has been out of action, But now, with surveys and tendering processes complete, the builders are in and hoping to finish by the middle of the month.

Ben Lucas, who chairs the trustees of Herrison Hall, said there had been considerable refurbishment work done in the hall, and once the new works are completed, the place should be open for business as soon as possible.

"There have been quite a few changes on the board of trustees and we are looking at ways to organise the day to day admin at the moment." he said.

Work on the roof has cost around £35,000. The main problem was a gable to the right of the entrance which collapsed in the storm, and then brought down part of the roof as it fell. It was found to lack the right sort of underpinning, so all the gables are now being fixed along with the damaged section of the roof.

Former parish councillor and community Baptist minister Ben said he was looking forward to seeing the Hall becoming once more a major hub of the Charlton Down community. "It is a great asset to our village," he said.

Want to feel good? Go for a walk!

Still struggling to shed those extra pounds acquired over Christmas?
Well Dorset Council wants us all to take up walking, and is even coordinating "health walks" for those of us who may need a little support or encouragement.

Walking, it says, is the perfect activity to improve your health and wellbeing. You can start slowly and build your fitness gently, at a pace that is comfortable for you. If you are looking to get more active and would like to walk in the company of others, then a health walk could be for you!

20 miles of footpaths

The council's website
(www.dorsetcouncil.gov.uk/dorsethealth-walks) lists the dates and times
of group walks across the county. In
Dorchester the walks take place every
Monday and Tuesday and are organised by the Dorchester Strollers.
Walkers are accompanied by trained
leaders and there's always a backmarker to look after any stragglers.

But if organised walking in a group is not your thing, then there are plenty of options here in our villages. According to Charminster Parish Council we have at least 20 miles of footpaths and bridleways.

The County Council has a free online mapping tool called Dorset Explorer which shows all the local rights of way, and the Ordnance Survey app allows you to plan and store your routes on your phone.

Get the bug

The Cerne Valley Way starts here in Charminster and wends its way north up the river valley. Don't be put off by the fact that this circular walk is 26 miles long. Try breaking it up into manageable chunks and do a section each weekend. There's a shorter version, the Cerne Valley Walk, which also passes through Charminster and is only 11 miles long.

And if you really get the bug, take a look at the Ramblers website: (www.ramblers.org.uk/) There are hundreds of walks listed across the UK. But they also give details of local rambles where once again you get the services of an experienced guide.



Hardy wreath

Candlemas will be celebrated on February 2, the presentation of the young Jesus in the temple to the aged Simeon and the lighting of candles. The shepherds had returned to their flocks, but the three Kings stayed until this day when they returned to their home countries.

Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day) on the 9th and Ash Wednesday on the 10th. It marks the first day of lent and 40 days of preparation for Easter. The ASH being the burnt remains of the previous year's palm crosses and placed as a cross on the forehead.
