

"No" to estate extension

Parish councillors have given the thumbs down to a controversial extension to the Charminster Farm housing development. They said the new homes would have a damaging impact on the nearby conservation area and would add to existing traffic concerns.

The plan for Phase 4 of Charminster Farm was unveiled by Wyatt Homes at a well-attended annual village meeting in the Community Hall.

Fewer houses

Planning consultants had designed a new layout for the site off Wanchard Lane. They addressed earlier concerns about the development by reducing the number of homes from 41 to 30 and said the houses would be built around a new central green. They said that the houses at the top of the site would not intrude into views across the river valley.

But residents are worried about the impact of the development on existing properties in North Street, and there were fears of further traffic

problems in the village. There were calls for a halt to piecemeal development until a comprehensive transport strategy had been agreed.

Councillor Peter Dangerfield said that despite assurances, the first phase of Charminster Farm had proved to be a significant intrusion on the conservation area. Views across the village from East Hill were "far worse" than indicated on the developer's original drawings. Councillor Tim Yarker said the proposed extension would also be visible from across the valley.

Detailed traffic survey

Councillor Louisa Swabey-Payne said the extra houses would generate more traffic and that drivers would use the narrow village streets as a ratrun. She said Dorset's Highways Department should carry out a detailed review of traffic in the village and devise a comprehensive strategy before any further development was permitted.

Councillors agreed a motion objecting the planned Phase 4 extension because of its impact on the conservation area and the threat of incremental increases in traffic. The final decision on the proposal rests with Dorset County Council.

Could planning changes and water fears kill off Norchester?

Threats to Dorchester's water supply, first disclosed in The Pilot last month, have been confirmed by Wessex Water. In an email sent to Dorset councillors, the company said that a major new development of 4,000 homes between Charminster and Stinsford poses risks to the public drinking water supply which cannot be mitigated without significant investment.

The company expressed concern that the aquifers feeding the Eagle Lodge borehole in Stinsford may become so contaminated that the borehole has to be abandoned and new reservoirs constructed.

The Dorset Echo said the water com-

pany's concerns may have dealt a "fatal blow" to plans for the huge new development.

Campaign groups opposed to Dorset Council's draft Local Plan are also assessing the implications of the Government's proposed Levelling up and Regeneration Bill announced in the Queen's Speech. According to the Daily Mail "Ministers will look at how the planning inspectorate handles targets on local housing requirements, with greenbelt and areas of natural beauty no longer forced to meet 'unrealistic' goals as long as they produce a plausible plan."

Rev'd Mark off to pastures new

Rev'd Mark Phillips, Rector at St Mary's Charminster and St Michael's in Stinsford, is leaving the parish after six years in the villages.

He and wife Clare are off to harbour village Watchet and small town Williton in north Somerset to take on two churches.

"I shall be sad to leave everyone here but am looking forward to new challenges there", he said.

Mark, who also looks after four other churches —in Stratton, Frampton, Burton Bradstock and Sydling St Nicholas— had not planned on leaving the local benefice yet, but when a good friend showed him the advert for the Somerset incumbency he realised the profile fitted him to a T. And the church authorities there evidently agreed.

Hampshire-born Mark, 55, says his main aim is to get out into the communities and meet people. "I want to

open the church up for everyone and have other things going on there. A bit like we have done here with Messy Church, Breakfast Church and other activities."

After coming to the ministry following a career in social care and education, Mark spent three years as a curate on Portland before arriving in Charminster for his first incumbency. *I've particularly loved working with the school here, and with Kingston Maurward College and their studio school", he said.

His teacher wife Clare, who works for the Salisbury Diocese Rural Help initiative and is training to become a licensed lay minister, will also miss all friends in Charminster, he added.



Challenges and conservation for fishermen

Retired dentist Bryan Sennett, who lives in Westleaze, Charminster, has been fishing the local chalk streams for decades, and chairman of Dorchester Fishing Club since 2010.

He's been looking at the history of the club and the future conservation of the rivers in the face of ecological threats and water abstraction.

He writes: Dorchester Fishing Club was founded in 1877 by 14 gentlemen from Dorchester which makes it on of the oldest fly fishing clubs in the UK.

Fool the fish

They formed the club to fish for brown trout using only a technique known as "upstream dry fly". This means an imitation of an insect is cast at the end of a floating line upstream of a feeding fish in the hope that the trout will be fooled into thinking the fly is real, try to eat it and be hooked.

It is probably the least effective and most difficult way to catch a trout and therein lies its challenge for the fisherman! It is generally considered to be the most demanding of all angling techniques.

The founding members of the club originally leased part of the River Frome close to Dorchester from the Duchy of Cornwall. The club still has the same water and with additional leases, purchases and two very generous bequests from members, now has 12 miles of superb chalk stream fishing. 75 members and more than 100 on the witing list. We still have the same single upstream dry fly only rule, but members are permitted to use other techniques for pike and grayling in season.

Conservation

The clubs ethos is conservation of our precious chalk streams and the creatures that live in them. We do not introduce trout from fish farms and all fish caught are now safely returned to the river.

DFC is fortunate in having as our river keeper John Aplin, one of the most able and knowledgeable keepers in the country. John, with a small team of assistants and occasional help from club members maintains the river banks, deals with fallen and overgrown trees, broken down fences, and maintains stiles and bridges.

Eroding banks are protected with flow deflectors and groynes made on site from fallen timber and the current redirected to create pools and speed the flow to clear the spawning gravels of accumulated silt. The keeper also works as a bailiff to discourage poaching (a criminal offence since 1986).

The clubs conservation work appears to be paying off as in 2021 almost 2000 brown trout were caught and returned, with some specimens up to 4lbs.

Eyes and ears

The club members, apart from fishing, also act as the eyes and ears of the river. Anglers are the first to notice any signs of pollution or illegal activity that may be a threat to the river, and our waters are used by various agencies for regular scientific monitoring of fish and insect life which makes the Frome the most rigorously studied chalk stream in the UK. Another of the keeper's jobs is a yearly count of spawning redds to assess salmon and sea trout numbers.

We need our chalk streams to remain

in good health and at present they are under threat as never before. Agricultural run-off chokes the water plants and silt clogs the gravel. The run -off also contains agrochemicals which affect weed growth and insect life

Biggest danger

But probably the greatest threat of all is abstraction from the aquifers which feed them. With every person now consuming more than 150 litres of water each day I doubt if the aquifer can possibly supply the future demand if Dorchester and surrounding villages continue to expand to the size our planners and politicians have in mind. If this is allowed to happen then the result of one or two dry winters and hot summers will be that the smaller rivers like the Cerne will probably dry up and the Frome reduced to a trickle.

Mark Simons has been re-elected as Chairman of Charminster Parish Council for a further term. Carol Matthews, who serves as vice-chair, was also unanimously re-elected.

The survey to test residents' support for lasting tributes to the Queen and her Platinum Jubilee has had an excellent response. There was an 80% approval for the Charminster scheme and 73% were in favour of the Charlton Down plans. The proposal for Charminster includes a commemorative piece of engraved Portland stone set opposite the village hall, while in Charlton Down, four large engraved Portland stone seats will be placed in the enclosed field behind the cricket pavilion which will become known as Jubilee Field.




