Stinsford News

For all the stated beginning of spring - the Meteorological first day, the Spring Equinox and the clocks going to British Summer Time, we would have hoped for a change, but it was not to be with some of the worst possible wind and rain to date. The new spring lambs arrived and tucked in against each other or their mothers, rarely putting their heads up in the damp, adverse cold weather. Gloomy days and as I write this piece for the Pilot it is April 1st and there is a promise of warm weather next week or is it an April Fool, I hope not.

This time last year we were voting on the Parish Plan. Now approved the Parish Council, with the support of working groups, is bringing forward the next stages.

The Coronation of King Charles 111 will be the focus in early May. It is some 70 years since his mother Queen Elizabeth 11 was crowned in June 1953.

On Saturday, May 6th, 2023, the bells will be rung at Stinsford following the completion of the crowning; many church bells will sound throughout the country on this day.

On Sunday May 7th a "Songs of Praise" service with some of the best loved hymns and this will be followed by cake and fizz to celebrate. A group in Stinsford has come together to arrange a 'street party' using the space provided by St Michael's car park. A dozen large tables are ordered, together with chairs and bunting to match. All parish folk are invited to bring food to share and drink for themselves and enjoy the events of the day. A large, appropriately coloured, coronation cake will be on hand with a piece for all. If the weather is not good, we will then all move inside the church, so the event will still go ahead. Looking forward to a great party atmosphere around Stinsford on this day. There is also a fun competition - make your own crown for the day, it may be just that wonderful, best hat of yours so bring it along.

May also brings two Christian festivals:

Ascension Day on Thursday May 18th - 40 days since the resurrection and Jesus having gone through life, ministry, death, and resurrection ascends to heaven on this day.

Pentecost which falls on the fourth Sunday May 28th, namely 50 days from Easter. It is also known as Whitsunday to Anglicans and Methodists as the Christian holy day of Pentecost and commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Christ's disciples as described in Acts 2. In England it took on some characteristics of Beltane, which originated from the pagan celebration of Summer's Day. Whitsuntide. In medieval times, the week following Whitsunday, was one of three holiday weeks where the villein on most manors was free from service on the lord's demesne. This marked a pause in the agricultural year. Whit Monday, the day after Whitsun, as many of us will remember, remained a holiday in Britain until 1971 when, with effect from 1972, it was replaced with the title, the Spring Bank Holiday, being the last Monday in May.

Many if not all will know by now that it was announced recently that our assistant curate, the Reverend Leila Mather is to become Rector of the six parishes within the benefice of Charminster, Stinsford and the Chalk Stream (Bradford Peverell, Stratton, Frampton and Sydling St Nicholas) and will be licensed in St Mary's, Charminster on 5th September 2023. We still await news as to whether the Diocese are to replace the House for Duty priest, formally the Reverend Penny Kennedy, now retired and housed in Stratton.

Cost of living grants update

The Government has confirmed that a new series of cost of living grants will be paid this year. These include £900 to the most vulnerable households, and an extension of the support for pensioners and people with disabilities.


8 million families on means tested benefits will receive £900 in three instalments, with the first payment between 25 April to 17 May this year for eligible households. The next £300 will come sometime in Autumn this year, with the final payment in Spring 2024.

There will be a separate disability cost of living payment of £150 this summer.

The Dept of Work and Pensions (DWP) will also extend the £300 winter fuel payment - a bonus known as the Pensioner's Cost of Living Payment - for the winter 2023/24

Stinsford Parish Council News

Ever thought of becoming a councillor? It can be a very rewarding role. It is a good time to take it on for a trial period at present. In May 2024 all Stinsford Parish Council seats will be up for re election. This means that the Council can co-opt councillors to fill our three vacant seats and if it is not for you then you simply need not stand for election in May 2024.

To qualify to become a councillor all you have to do is live or work in the parish. There are over 80,000 local councillors in England accountable to residents in their localities hopefully trying to make a positive contribution to their communities.

Stinsford like all civil parish councils is a legally recognised body with specified duties in its administrative boundaries. Stinsford Parish Council has a long history. It was formed in 1894 following the enactment of the Local Government Act (1894). This created parish councils on more or less the same basis as they exist today. The history of the civil parishes is however much older. Indeed the Digger Gerrard Winstanley in the 17th Century proposed that civil parishes could create a federated set of political institutions to replace the nation state. Today's parish councils generally have a much more limited role than Winstanley envisaged but still have a wide range of functions that are valued by their communities. In part this is because as the lowest level in the hierarchy of government organisation the parish councils are closer to the people that they represent.

While it is clear that Stinsford Parish Council is not going to change the world it does provide a platform to think about what will help to make Stinsford a better place for local residents. I hope that this is apparent to those of you that have read our Climate and Ecological Emergency Strategy and the Stinsford Neighbourhood Plan. It is also expressed through our responses to consultations by central government, Dorset Council and others. A recent example is our response to the governments consultation on the Levelling-up and Regeneration Bill that will determine land use planning practice for the foreseeable future once passed into law. Being a parish councillor is about trying to sort out issues that mean so much to many residents, ensuring that the footpaths network is usable; maintaining the Lower Bockhampton Playfield; campaigning over road safety and all else. It's sometimes these things that are so important in the everyday lives of residents.

Please contact me or any of the other councillors if you have any interest in becoming, or trying out the role of, a parish councillor. We would be delighted to explain the role in more detail or try to address any concerns that you may have in considering this. We really do need your support.


