So here we are into brand new year 2023 and it is a good time to look back a little ...

All the Christmas events went very well. The Carol Service, for all it was not the best of weather, was well supported. The readings together with the carols followed by mulled wine and mince pies and the Grand Draw went down a storm with some 15 prizes and some very happy winners. The Draw raised £536 with the valuable support of the Watercress Company, parishioners and congregation, Jamie & Ariane Jones of the Yalbury Cottage Hotel together with the two major local golf courses and other known local attractions. **The Christmas Eve Mass at 8pm** saw a fine congregation with Bruce Dixon officiating, followed by **Christmas Day** morning with again a well full church and Rob van der Hart leading the service. At both we do so enjoy a good song and all were in good voice with our organist Malcolm's excellent music.

In December the committee drawn from all churches within the Benefice was to consider the applications for the role of a new Rector and action the results in January but there were none to date so for the moment we continue without and await some further news from the Archdeacon. Our Leila will continue with the support of Rob

van der Hart, Dick Luther, Bruce Dixon and Hugh Willis.

As January 1st was a Sunday we enjoyed a New Year Day Service and a Communion to boot with both host and wine if happy to share and the opportunity to wish fellow members of the congregation A Happy New Year. A very good service and sermon with Bruce Dixon officiating.

The following week brought the approach of Epiphany and the arrival of the Three Kings and the end of the twelve days of Christmas. The traditional removal of the decorations took place whilst the Nativity Scene remains.

On 14th January Westminster Abbey will see the 95th Anniversary of Thomas Hardy's death and annual memorial service in Poet's Corner and a wreath containing Stinsford Yew laid supported by members choice of poems and readings.

I do hope members of our Parish will take a look at the new Kingston Maurward University hub with their invitation circulated via the January Pilot for the 3rd February 2023 and our debate over the question of climate change.

Finally I was captivated by the photograph on the front of the January 2023 issue and to see the view through St Michael's lower cemetery gate as you walk back up Church Lane, I wonder how many recognised it?

News from Stinsford Parish Council

It's that time of year when people are keen to hide away in their homes avoiding the cold dark days of winter and, from a parish council position, when fewer planning permissions are submitted, fewer concerns raised about the footpaths network etc. and we can turn our attention to other things. One of the key issues we discussed at our last council meeting was implementing the Stinsford Parish Council Communications Strategy and how to raise issues that matter to you in order to develop solutions and inform action.

The council developed a Communications Strategy last summer and adopted it in the autumn with a view to improving communication channels with residents and businesses in the parish. Effective communication is not just about informing residents what we, as a council, are doing. We want to generate interest and encourage active engagement and involvement with the council. The Stinsford Parish Council Communications Strategy can be found on the councils web-site (click on the Working Documents tab).

The proposed communication channels in the Strategy are aspirational and subject to ongoing development. As you would expect the Strategy involves keeping the councils web site up to date and we hope you are enjoying these regular articles in the Pilot, but we also want to establish Facebook and Twitter sites. Please look at the Strategy and if you can think of any other approaches that may be helpful please let us know.

The council is nothing if not informed by residents of the issues that they consider important in the parish. Sometimes these, such as problems with the highway network, can become long drawn out concerns as we struggle to establish necessary communications with external bodies but at least with the help of residents we can better understand the issues. While residents are encouraged to attend and bring issues to 'public participation time' at every council meeting, we also appreciate that not everyone has the time to attend meetings. We would like to draw attention to other work being taken forward by the council such as tackling climate change, and discuss this with residents.

We recognise that we need to use local media and particularly the Dorset Echo more and continue utilising the Pilot. We have just launched 'Stinsford Parish Council' Facebook site. Please join. Hopefully this will be followed soon by a Twitter account.

To get the conversation started and keep it going will require a lot of work by the very small number of parish councillors above their other council duties. As with most of the councils work we would be delighted with any offers of assistance. Help would be especially welcome to assist with Facebook and Twitter.

Update from Dorchester & Sherborne offices of Central Dorset Citizens Advice

“With the colder weather, I’ve noticed mould and damp in our flat. It’s mainly in our bedroom, including some black mould on the carpet. I’ve been chasing our letting agency, who say they’ll speak to our landlord. I’m really worried about how this might affect our health. Our tenancy agreement isn’t up for eight months, what can I do?”

- **To raise the issue with your letting agency is a good move.** Unfortunately, it isn’t always easy to work out the cause of mould or damp and this can make it difficult to work out if your landlord is responsible, unless there’s an obvious cause, like a leaking roof.
- **There are many causes of damp** in properties with rising, penetrating, construction and condensation damp as the most common. On our website there is information that may help you work out what type of damp you have, who is responsible and what you can do.
- **A common cause of damp is condensation.** To prevent this, it’s important to keep homes well-heated and well-ventilated, but this will be trickier to do given the colder weather and higher heating costs. You may be eligible for help to insulate and heat your home and should visit our website that has advice on such schemes, as well as things that can make damp worse and may impact the landlord taking responsibility for repairs, such as drying clothes on heaters or blocking air vents.

- **Check your tenancy agreement** too for references to repairs and damp. A landlord will have to act in relation to damp if it makes the property unsafe for someone to live in such as if it is making the tenant or a member of their family ill. The landlord will also be responsible if the damp is related to repairs they should have carried out, like if heaters are broken. If the damp has damaged items that the landlord is responsible for, such as carpets and window frames, they'll likely have to pay the cost of repairs.
- **Steps you can take** include reporting your landlord to the local authority if he/she is responsible for the damp in your property but doesn't act,
- **Use the landlord's formal complaints procedure** If you're in social housing. There is more information about this on our website.

Contact your local Citizens Advice on anything you're unsure about.

It is important to speak to an adviser first if it reaches the point where you want to get out of a fixed term tenancy agreement early as there might be better ways to approach the issue.

An End and A beginning

As a person new to living in the West of our lovely Dorset County, I am seeing things with fresh eyes, everyday things that long time residents and locals have grown accustomed to and absorbed into their everyday lives. Christmas 2022 was no exception.

My previous experience of heralding in the Christmas season began with decorating the house – both inside and out. Tree Collections Update

During the weekend of the 7th January many volunteers drove throughout Dorset from Weymouth to Beaminster to Sherborne, Dorchester and surrounding areas to collect Christmas trees from private homes and businesses.

Local parishioners: Jim Thurston, Chris Gotel, Sally and Richard Warburton and many others used trucks provided by Dorset Vehicle Rentals, donned Hi-Viz jackets and gloves and braved the appalling weather and used GPS to collect approximately 1200 trees over three days.

The whole event was organised by Tamzin and Pete Hyde of Trinity Trees to raise money for the Weldmar Hospice. A donation of £10 on their website enabled the hospice to receive £12,00 for their charity.

Without the kindness of the volunteers and the generosity of the companies who provided the equipment free of charge, this event could not have happened.

Thanks also go to Knighton Countryside Management who chip the trees free of charge. The chippings are then taken to Taunton Bioreactor to produce electricity. Magna Housing and Pipe Fix Ltd also provided trucks and volunteers.

Fiona Hansford is Weldmar's Business Development Fundraiser, and says, "It's really great news that we have raised more money than ever before with Treecycle, which goes directly towards the specialist care that we provide to adults in Dorset with a life limiting illness, and the support we give to their loved ones. We couldn't do this without the support of the team at Trinity Street Christmas Trees and all the volunteers.

Pilot Distributor Needed

Due to a retirement, we are in need of a further distributor to make our team back up to 6, which then means that no one member of the team needs to distribute the Pilot more than twice a year, thus spreading the load.

The process is that the Pilots, all 1650, are delivered in boxes to the distributor's house, where he or she or they (because we have some couples who carry out the task) break them down into the numbers required by each of the 27 deliverers in Charminster, before dropping them off in carrier bags, to their respective homes ready for delivery.

The Distributor also makes block deliveries to both Stinsford (160) and Charlton Down (600) who have their own Distributors and delivery teams.

Beforehand, the Distributor would need to collect the carrier bags from the Charminster church porch, (all Waitrose carrier bags) where deliverers return them on completion of their delivery; because of the large numbers required by certain individual deliverers, copies may be left in the boxes to assist in delivery.

Distributors usually set aside a day to complete the task but with a little experience, this time becomes shorter. Training will be given.

Q. Has the parish council set its budget for next year and what will this mean for the council tax?

A. The parish council has agreed its budget for the next financial year. The overall council tax bill is virtually all made up from the requirements of Dorset Council and Police and Fire Services. The parish council part is very small making up around £35 on a band D property. The parish council have agreed a rise of 3.8% for the coming year.

Q. If we get another very cold spell of weather, who do I contact if a salt bin near me needs filling up?

A. If you notice a salt bin near you is getting empty, please contact Sarah, the Parish Clerk preferably by email (clerk@charminster.info) or by phone (01305 819429) and she will contact Dorset Council. Each salt bin has been classified as either a 'strategic' or 'community' bin - 'strategic' bins are refilled by Dorset Council free of charge during the winter whereas 'community' bin refills are paid for by the Parish Council.

Q. What sports can be played at the Community Hall?
